

# ANDREU NIN

A special slogan cancel was authorized for use in December 1992 in Spain to commemorate the Centenary of the birth of Andreu Nin. Bro. Juan Sabater Pie, member No. 243 of Barcelona, author of this article states that this cancel is quite rare - he has only seen five copies to date and it is impossible to buy a copy.

Andreu Nin, born in 1892, was a noted political writer and teacher in Spain. He started on his political path in 1912 when he affiliated with the Socialist Party. He travelled to USSR where he collaborated with Lenin in the organization of the III INTERNATIONAL. He was expelled from the Communist Party and returned to Spain in 1931. He was the founder of the P.O.U.M. (Wolker Party of Marxist Unification) in 1932. In 1936, when the Civil War began, he was a Consellor of Justice in the Generalitat of Catelonia. He wrote for several reviews and magazines such as "L'hora", "Front" and "Catalonia People" during his lifetime. He was assassinated in 1938 in a political rivalry.

Bro. Andreu Nin was initiated on December 20, 1914, in Adelante Lodge ("Farther Off") with the symbolic name of "Pestalozzi". He was also a member of Humanity and Justice Lodges - all in Barcelona City. All of these Lodges were under the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge Catalano-Balear.

Bro. Sabater clarifies the use of a symbolic name: In Spain, several years ago, it was necessary to have a symbolic name because of the great danger from the State. Consequently, all Masons had a symbolic name. Bro. Sabater's symbolic name when he was initiated 10 years ago was "Joan Impack". Now, he is happy to report, it is not necessary to carry a "secret name" and one can use his own name with no fear of persecution.

### NOTES AND REQUESTS FROM BRO. LONGENECKER

THE FIRST ROCKET AIRMAIL FLIGHT was made February 23, 1936, at Greenwood Lake, N.Y., in an eleven foot rocket with a fifteen foot wing spread powered by liquid oxygen and alcohol. The inventors -Willy Ley, Louis Goodman and Hugh Franklin Pierce - and the flight sponsor - Frido W. Kessler - were all non-Masons.


The rocket carried 4323 letters and 1826 post cards; each item was franked with special rocket stamps in addition to the regular postage stamps. Bro. Longenecker, being a collector of Masonic Space Covers and related items, would like to add a piece of this mail to his collection. If any member knows where he can purchase a cover or card or even just a photocopy thereof, it would be sincerely appreciated. The major significance of this event to Bro. Stan is that on that day in history - February 23, 1936 - he entered into this world and not by rocket flight.

CANADIAN DESIGN-IT-YOURSELF POSTAGE STAMPS. Congratulations must be extended to the Canadian Post Office for producing such a great and popular postage stamp. 500,000 booklets were sold-out in one week. He hopes that our Canadian members bought some and thought to rubber stamp the Masonic Square and Compasses design in the blank center. This would result in the first Masonic stamp of that country. If each of you forgot, there will be another chance when the newly printed ones come out in June.

If anyone has such a D.I.Y. on cover and would like to trade it with Bro. Stan, he will offer 2 dozen different NATSCO Masonic covers in trade. Such a stamp or cover would certainly be an asset to a Masonic Stamp Collection.

<u>MASONIC PERFINS</u>. Every once in a while, one runs across perfins with a particular design or initials cut into a stamp. Every once in a while of those occurrences, one notices that the design is Masonic in nature. Bro. Stan has forwarded an example of the Masonic symbol on the Henry Knox stamp and the initials "G.W." on the 1938 one cent Washington stamp. These examples are shown here as well as three more examples found in your Editor's file that were submitted by Bro. Norm Lincoln. Bro. Ed Walsh, a noted cover producer of the 60s and 70s had a Masonic Perfin instrument as does Bro. John Cunningham. I believe Bro. George Wettach also possesses one of these devices - an interesting way of creating Masonic Awareness.

# LUDWIG LEICHHARDT

Bro. William C. Eurich, member No. 86 of Rockwood, Maine, answered the plea in the previous newsletter for information on Bro. Ludwig Leichhardt, the Australian explorer noted on the Australian stamp shown here. Many thanks, Bro. Eurich.

Friedrich Wilhelm Ludwig Leichhardt (1813-1848), born in Prussia, was a German explorer in Australia. He went to New South Wales in 1841 and began geological investigations. He crossed the Australian Continent from Moreton Bay to Fort Essington in 1844-45 and described this expedition in a journal in 1847. He attempted an expedition across the continent from east to west but disappeared on the Cogoon

As stated in the previous newsletter, Bro. Leichhardt's Masonic affiliation is based on a statement by the historian of Prince of Wales Lodge No. 3 (U.G.L.Q.) that Allan Cunningham together with Logan and the explorers Leichhardt, Mitchell, Kennedy and Gregory were Freemasons. This statement is not further documented so is subject to some contraversy.





## ROY CLAXTON ACUFF

Roy Acuff - "The King of Country Music" - was born September 15, 1903, in Maynardsville, Tenn. He played semi-pro baseball and formed a group known as the Smoky Mountain Boys. Soon they were being broadcast over WNOX radio in Knoxville and making records. Roy cut 316 sides and sold more than thirty million records. During the 1940s he became a star of the Grand Ole Opry where he appeared for more than fifty years. He acted in eight movies. Among his favorite hits are "Wabash Cannon Ball", "Great Speckle Bird", "Night Train to Memphis" and "I Heard a Silver Trumpet". In 1962 he was elected to the Country Music Hall of Fame. On November 23, 1992, he died leaving behind a rich legacy of well-loved music.

Bro. Roy Acuff was raised on February 21, 1944, in East Nashville Lodge No. 560. Other members of that Lodge included "Smokey Mountain Boys" Beecher Kirby, Howdy Forrester, Tommy Jackson, Odis Rhodes and Lonnie Wilson. Roy belonged to the York Rite: Edward G. Corbitt Chapter No. 147, R.A.M., Nashville Council No. 1, R.& S.M., and Nashville Commandery No. 1, Knights Templar. He was a 33rd degree Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Southern Jurisdiction and a member of Al Menah Shrine AAONMS.

St. Vincent honored Bro. Acuff with a set of three stamps issued on January 17, 1994.


## BRITISH MASONIC STAMP

Pat was born in Oregon on March 17, 1909, and from early childhood on, was known as "Pat" as his birthday coincided with the Feast of St. Patrick.

After completing his education at Reed College in Portland he taught school for a while in a small town, became a seaman on a freighter and then became a newspaper reporter. He made his way to the East Coast with only a few dollars in savings and jobs were hard to find. After quite a few disappointments, he found employment on Wall Street as a runner making \$12 per week. Several years later he was promoted to cashier at the magnificent sum of \$24 a week.


During this time he became interested in stamp collecting and Nassau Street, the heart of philately at the time, became his second home. It wasn't long before he broadened his horizons from collecting and became a dealer. Since then, over 60 years, he has done more for philately than any other living person. His countless articles, 15 books and personal appearances all over the world have reached millions of collectors.

## COVER FOR GRAND LODGE OF DENMARK



## MASONIC COLLECTION VARIATIONS

Bro. Richard O. Wright, member No. 139 of Lodi, CA,, writes to tell us of some methods he is using to enhance his collection - actually three methods:

"First, I was curious about other Lodges with the same name as my own - "Lodi" - or Lodges in towns called Lodi. I discovered seven Lodi's in the USA but only two other Masonic Lodges in those towns. One is Lodi Valley Lodge No. 99 F.& A.M. in Lodi, Wisconsin. The other, Harrisville Lodge No. 137 F.& A.M. in Lodi, Ohio. I obtained addresses and both were very helpful in not only sending a Lodge Cover but also having them hand cancelled in the respective Lodi's.

"My other two pursuits are looking for Lodges with the number "256" (mine) and lastly obtaining covers from the numerous symbolically named Lodges, i.e., Tuscan, Doric, Charity, etc. Obtaining the covers is relatively inexpensive but very time consuming. Many rewards, however, have been found to supplement my Masonic collection of Lapel pins and commemorative coins. -

"Should any of the members wish to pursue this idea, I would suggest the following:

- 1. Get a current "List of Lodges" from your Grand Lodge.
- 2. Research each state to determine which Lodges are of interest to you.
- 3. Masonic Protocol requires you to send your list (should be in letter form) to your Grand Lodge and ask them to send it to the selected Grand Lodge.
- 4. When the mailing addresses are furnished to you of the constituent Lodges you can then write directly to them. I always send loose postage for their response.
- 5. Prepare for the following reactions:
  - A. Nice letters and notes and your request answered some very lengthy.
  - B. Your request answered but no correspondence.
  - C. Your request answered but no envelopes available (keep looking and writing).
  - D. No response.
