BRO. OTTO STEDING, SECRETARY-TREASURER

It is with deep personal sorrow that I announce that Bro. Otto Steding, our Secretary-Treasurer since 1984, was called by the Supreme Architect of the Universe to his Eternal Home on December 12, 2003. He apparently was not sick for long and his wife, daughter and granddaughter were with him at the Hospice during his final days. His last letter to me was in late September and he reported at that time that he was fighting a blood infection. The Unit will miss his dedicated service and enthusiastic involvement in the activities of the Masonic Study Unit and Masonic Philately. I had the pleasure of meeting Bro. Otto in 2000 when I was invited by Bro. Norman Lincoln to speak at a meeting of the Third District Chapter School, Ohio Grand Chapter, R.A.M. in Miamisburg, Ohio. The picture shown below was taken at that time and shows, right to left, Bros. Otto Steding, Norman Lincoln and Robert Domingue – the officers of the Masonic Study Unit at that time.



Bro. Otto was 86 years old this past July and was very active in Blue Lodge, York Rite and the Shrine. He served as Master in 1957. He received his 50 Year Membership recognition in the Order of Eastern Star in 2002. He and his wife relocated to the Mapleknoll Retirement Community in September 2000. He leaves behind his wife, Elaine, his daughter, Bonnie Olmstead (and husband), his granddaughter Karen Desbles (and husband) and three great grandchildren.


NEW MASONIC ISSUE

On October 29, 2003, this country issued a souvenir sheet to commemorate the origin of Freemasonry in Uruguay in 1856. The sheet and a First Day Cover are shown here. I was able to acquire them from Bro. Antonio G. de Paiva, member 192 of Rua Capitaio Vilarim 25 – Fabricas, 36301/008 – S.S. del Rei, M.G., Brazil via the eBay route. I have also acquired some copies of the mint sheet.







GRAND LODGE OF VIRGINIA SPECIAL MASONIC CANCEL



The Grand Lodge of Virginia was authorized to use this special cancel on October 30, 2003, to promote Freemasonry and to note that they were the first Grand Lodge to be constituted in America after the Declaration of Independence. Thanks to Bro. John Allen of the GWMSC for sharing this with us.


**RT. WOR. BRO. SIR SAMUEL GRIFFITH
(1845-1920)**

The man described as the “Father” of the Australian Constitution, Bro. Sir Samuel Walker Griffith, P.C., G.C.M.G., MA, was born at Merthyr Tydfil, Wales and immigrated to Australia in 1853. He was educated at Ipswich, Queensland; Woolloomooloo, Sydney and Maitland, New South Wales and graduated from the University of Sydney with first class honors. He returned to England and after a lengthy stay there returned to Australia when he was admitted to the Queensland Bar in 1867.

He entered the Queensland Parliament in 1872 where he served as Attorney General and Premier on two occasions. He served as Queensland’s Chief Justice and when the High Court of Australia was established in 1903, he became the first Chief Justice. The first sitting of the High Court took place in the Banco Court of the Supreme Court Building in Melbourne on Oct. 6, 1903. The distinguished Bench was made up of three men who had been prominent in the Federal movement. They consisted of Bro. Sir Samuel Griffith (former Chief Justice of Queensland), Bro. Edmund Barton (Australia’s First Prime Minister and leader of Australia’s Constitutional Convention) who was appointed Justice and Justice Richard O’Connor.

Bro. Sir Samuel Walker Griffith was initiated in the “Victoria Lodge” No. 1186, English Constitution (now No. 10, Queensland Constitution) on August 22, 1865. He was installed Master of this Lodge in 1871. He was also a member of “Lodge Hiram” No. 286, Irish Constitution (now No. 9, Queensland Constitution). He was District Grand Registrar for the District Grand Lodge of Queensland, English Constitution in 1871 and District Senior Grand Warden the following year. He was installed as Provincial Grand Master for Queensland of the Irish Constitution in 1893.

Australia issued a two value set on September 2, 2003, to commemorate the Centenary of the High Court of Australia. Bro. Griffith is pictured on the 50c value; “Justice” is illustrated on the \$1.45 value.


CIVIL WAR MASONIC ENVELOPES

JOHANN KEPLER LAVATER (1741-1801)



Switzerland issued a stamp in 1941 to note the 200th Birth Anniversary of this noted Physiognomist (able to judge character from facial characteristics), Theologian and Poet. He is credited with being a Mason through a reference to him in Volume 7 of the A. Q. C. publication:



Diethelm Lavater (1743-1826) was the acknowledged leader of the Craft in Switzerland for upward of 50 years. John Henry Lavater, a widely traveled Freemason and Swiss physician, was Diethelm's nephew. John Henry's father was Johann who is stated to have been "also a Freemason though not a medical practitioner". No Lodge details are given for him.

Born in Zurich, he took Protestant Orders in 1769. He became known by a volume of poems "Swiss Songs" (1767) and his "Prospect of Eternity" (17768-7) is characterized by religious enthusiasm and mysticism. He attempted to elevate Physiognomy into a science in five volumes written between 1789 And 1798 – "Essays on Physiognomy" designed to promote the knowledge and love of mankind. While attending the wounded during the capture of Zurich (1799), he himself received a serious wound from which he later died.



JOHN WILKES

(1727-1797)

“FRIEND OF LIBERTY”

A USPS postal card cancelled 100 years ago on Washington’s Birthday honoring Brother/President McKinley. It may be addressed to the Presiding Master at Shickshinny, PA or a person by the name of P. Master. The reverse side of the card cites the price of the Wilkes-Barre Semi-Weekly Paper as being one dollar a year. The city of Wilkes-Barre lies in North East Pennsylvania and was incorporated in 1871. Once a great anthracite mining center during the early 1900s, it was named for 18th Century English politicians, John Wilkes and Isaac Barre who defended the American Colonies. The city lies on the Susquehanna River and was badly damaged by hurricane Agnes in 1972.




John Wilkes was a member of Parliament from 1757 to 1764 and served as Lord Mayor of London in 1774. He championed the Colonial rights in the American Revolution. He was put in prison several different times and while there in 1769 he was supposedly made a Mason – although this fact is disputed by some.




AUSTRIAN MASONIC COVERS


LEWIS AND CLARK ALL PURPOSE COVER


